She noted the budget for this plan is incomplete, and is not specifically included as part of the recommendation but reflects information that is currently available. Once approved, the plan would be a two-year process which the Task Team will continue to work on implementing. B. Chesney said he would be willing to supervise University of Waterloo co-op students that could work as the Social Media Resource person, in four-month term placements at a time.
